This document serves as an addendum to the 2019-2020 King University Catalog to provide the program requirements related to the *Interdisciplinary Studies Elementary Education, BA K-5 Licensure* for Adult and Graduate Studies and Traditional students. This document also serves as an addendum with corrections to the published 2019-2020 University Catalog. It should be noted that the program requirements outlined herein are to replace the current Interdisciplinary Studies Elementary Education, BA K-5 Licensure requirements for both Adult and Graduate Studies and Traditional students in the 2019-2020 Catalog.

Section: Academic Programs (Pages 128-132) Interdisciplinary Studies Elementary Education, BA K-5 Licensure. After the final 2019/20 academic catalog was posted, it was found that the Interdisciplinary Studies Elementary Education, BA K-5 Licensure program requirements were not correct for both Adult and Graduate Studies and Traditional students. Therefore, the Office of Registration and Records made the decision to combine the information for both AGS and TRAD under one program since the majority of the requirements were the same for both types of students.

The B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies (IDST), a minor in Education, and K-5 Licensure requirements, prepare students interested in public school teaching in Grades K-5.

The Adult and Graduate Studies program is designed for students who have completed an Associate of Science in Teaching (AST) degree; however, other applicants may be considered. The Elementary Education program (courses specific to the discipline of Education) is a two-year program leading to the elementary (K-5) licensure in Tennessee as well as a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies (IDST), which gives students the broad exposure to content across the liberal arts disciplines that is necessary for elementary teachers.

Because AGS programs differ in scope and choices, even within one state, all students will be advised during the admission process to King University, and will be provided with an audit of their transcripts from prior institutions. This transcript audit will provide students a guide to the courses they need for the Interdisciplinary Studies major. These courses may be taken prior to transfer, or completed by taking King courses. It will also clarify for incoming students how they will achieve three things: B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies, Education minor, and requirements for licensure in Tennessee.

Students are encouraged to meet with King University faculty to discuss these audits and develop degree completion plans. Degree completion plans will take into account any prior coursework that may substitute for courses that appear here and will identify additional courses required for licensure in Tennessee that were not included within a student's previous college work.

By completing general education requirements, the content-specific courses in the Interdisciplinary Studies curriculum, electives at the 3000 or higher level in the IDS major, and the minor in Education, students will have the 124 semester hours required for graduation from King.

#### **Grades K-5 Licensure Track**

To be licensed in Grades K-5 in Tennessee, students must pass the following PRAXIS exams: Elementary Education: Multiple Subjects 5001, Teaching Reading: Elementary Education 5203, prior to student teaching and complete the edTPA exam.
