accredited & achievable

- Students take two classes at a time for 7 weeks (4 classes/semester). One week off each semester for rest and reflection
- Clinical experiences are incorporated into individual courses. Students will participate in community service learning projects and workplace quality improvement/change projects
- General education courses are blended and require some online assignments**
- Face-to-face classes meet one evening a week
- Students may enter directly from an accredited Associate RN or Diploma program

- Associate degree in Nursing or diploma (30 hours of core general education requirements)
- Complete the Application online at apply.king.edu
- Copy of current unencumbered TN or compact state RN license with ability to practice in Tennessee (A new graduate from an associate degree or diploma program may be accepted on provisional status for one academic semester to obtain and submit an RN license to the School of Nursing. Students who fail to obtain and submit an RN license to the School of Nursing prior to the start of the second semester will be unable to attend nursing classes but may continue in general education courses until an RN license is obtained and submitted to the School of Nursing.)
- Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended**
- Laptop computer, with minimum of Office 2010 or later and wireless and webcam capability required
***Students whose cumulative GPA falls below 2.75 will be asked to submit a personal essay*
