Traditional BSN Plan of Study

The BSN degree program is an intense upper-division program. This requires that students complete the Nursing Program Core Requirements and Nursing Prerequisites before beginning nursing major courses. Students who have completed all core requirements, prerequisites and have earned a minimum of 3.0 cumulative GPA will generally be considered eligible to begin the nursing program. In certain cases, a student may be permitted to begin nursing major courses if lacking up to a maximum of 8 outstanding credits (12 credits if RELG 1001 is lacking) from the Nursing Program Core Requirements. The outstanding credits must be completed prior to the start of the final (Senior 2) clinical semester.
