BY THE PEOPLE, FOR THE PEOPLE

Tour the US Capitol, the Supreme Court, and the Library of Congress. In the Capitol, see where Congress is housed, and learn about its storied history; at the Supreme Court, learn about the functions and nature of the court; and in one of the most beautiful interiors in Washington, the Library of Congress, see a copy of the Gutenberg Bible, Thomas Jefferson's library, the first map which says "America," and the spectacular reading room.

CAPITOL HILL AND BEYOND

Take a walk from Union Station to Capitol Hill, viewing the Capitol, Supreme Court and Library of Congress on the way to a tour of the Belmont-Paul Women's Equality National Monument. After the tour enjoy a walk to Eastern Market to browse the many vendors and enjoy this unique area of DC for lunch. Finish with a walk to the National Mall where you can see the Smithsonian museums and several of the monuments.

CAPITOL POLICE

Visit with the police force that protects the Capitol buildings and grounds. After meeting with the police force we will be escorted on a tour of the U.S. Capitol Building.

_____ CENTRAL UNION MISSION: CARING FOR THE HOMELESS

In this track we will be spending time at one of DC's oldest, continually running homeless shelters where we will be assisting with housekeeping tasks and preparing and serving lunch to residents.

_____ FRACTAL WORLDS VIRTUAL ART EXPERIENCE-ART+TECH!

Explore the mind-bending sci-fi worlds and infinite 3D geometric patterns of Fractal Worlds, new immersive and virtual art experience at ARTECHOUSE. The exhibition incorporates virtual reality work that is highly immersive and can feel extremely realistic. Viewer discretion is advised.

_____ FROM THE BARD TO BLACK HISTORY

Visit two unique D.C. attractions in one day: the Folger Shakespeare Library and the National Museum of African American History and Culture.

GO VIRAL: GLOBAL EPIDEMICS

If you're interested in human disease and global health, this is the Friday Track for you! We will visit the special exhibit "Outbreak: Epidemics in a Connected World" at the Museum of Natural History, and hear from an infectious disease specialist behind the scenes.

_____ INSIDER TOUR OF NATIONALS PARK, HOME OF THE WASHINGTON NATIONALS

We will have a tour of Nationals Park and learn the rich history behind the team and get to see many of the private access areas of the stadium.

_____ INTERNATIONAL SPY MUSEUM --WHAT'S REAL, WHAT ISN'T?

Students will tour the museum exhibits and learn about American espionage and foreign policy. The goal will be to have a fun time learning about our history, but students will leave having been taught to ask questions and seek the truth.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS: A PALACE

Students will visit the Library of Congress for two guided tours: one through the Jefferson Building, and one through the Performing Arts Collection highlights.

_____ LIFE AT THE BIG 4 - AN INTRODUCTION TO THE ACCOUNTING PROFESSION

Tour the PricewaterhouseCoopers office in Tyson's Corner where you will learn about what it's like (and what it takes) to work for the largest accounting firms in the world.

LINCOLN'S ASSASSINATION

This track takes students to Ford's Theatre, the site of Abraham Lincoln's assassination. The track includes a visit to a museum centered on Lincoln's presidency and assassination, a tour of the theatre gallery itself, and a tour of the nearby Peterson House where Lincoln died.

MEMORIES OF WAR: HOW AND WHY WE REMEMBER OUR MILITARY ENDEAVORS A discussion and walking tour of the

military memorials on the Mall, to include the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the National WWII Memorial, and the Korean War Memorial. Due to the extent of walking, comfortable shoes are required for this track.

NATURE SEE & DO

Morning tour of the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History followed by an afternoon of kayaking in DC waterways.

_____ NOT FAKE NEWS: EXPLORING JOURNALISM AT NATIONAL PUBLIC RADIO IN AN AGE OF "ALTERNATIVE FACTS"

This track will give students an inside look at how the news is produced and reported at National Public Radio (NPR) and will include a Q&A with Elizabethton native and NPR Digital Political Reporter Jessica Taylor. This track is ideal for students interested in Communications, DMAD, or Political Science and NPR groupies.
