NESCC Dual Admission – Associate of Applied Science in Nursing (LPN to RN) to King University – Bachelor of Science in Nursing for Registered Nurses

Generally, Associate of Applied Science degrees are not accepted for meeting general education requirements at King University. All transfer candidates entering academic programs must complete RELG 1001 Foundations of Christian Thought and Practice (4 s.h.). All courses below are offered in a modular format. A modular is a course that is shorter than full term and does not span the entire payment period or period of enrollment. Modular courses can be five, seven or eight week courses.

KING 1010 ACORN: All students on all delivery platforms in undergraduate major programs must take the ACORN. The test is the mandatory Pre-Test for the Quality Enhancement Plan. The ACORN is a test that students take through Canvas in their first semester at King University. Any student who does not take the exam will not be able to register for the next semester (0 s.h)

Comprehensive Assessment for Core Curriculum: KING 4020

All students must take the OAK (Outcomes Assessment at King) basic subjects test on general education prior to graduation at King University.

Comprehensive Assessment for Major Curriculum: NURS 4990

All candidates for a degree from King are required to demonstrate competency in their major fields. Students will complete a comprehensive assessment during the semester when all major courses are completed. All students must pass the Assessment according to the minimum requirement of their specific programs. Any student who does not meet the requirement (pass) of his/her comprehensive assessment will not graduate until the requirement has been met. Registered Nurse students fulfill this requirement by completion of a portfolio assignment.
