Intent to Graduate Form NOW AVAILABLE



All graduates must submit the Intent to Graduate form. Information submitted on this form is used to plan graduation, print the commencement programs, and order diplomas.

WALKING EARLY

Any student who graduates in summer or fall will normally participate in commencement exercises the following spring. Students in bachelor's and master's programs can petition to march in the spring ceremony held prior to the conferral of their degree if they are registered for the deficiencies in the subsequent semester.

To petition to participate in an early commencement ceremony, students must supply a copy of their degree audit showing their plan for degree completion as well as indicating their preferred ceremony when submitting the Intent to Graduate form. Students can obtain their degree audits, plan courses for future semesters, and download the audit in PDF format by clicking the link to Conclusive through student portal.

Undergraduate Academic Honors

Academic honors shall be determined by the undergraduate student's King grade point average and total hours completed while in residency at King University.

Latin Honors

Graduates who have completed a minimum of 62 semester hours of graded coursework at King (excluding PLA, and Pass/Fail credits) will be eligible for the following Latin honors:

- GPA meeting or exceeding 3.500: cum laude; or
- GPA meeting or exceeding 3.700: magna cum laude; or
- GPA meeting or exceeding 3.900: summa cum laude.

With Distinction

Graduates who have completed 48-61 hours of graded coursework at King (excluding PLA, and Pass/Fail credits) and have a grade point average of 3.70 or higher will graduate With Distinction in their designated field of study.

Students in a graduate program are not eligible for academic honors due to the GPA expectations set by those programs. Students with degrees conferred in a later semester (ie summer or fall 2026) will not have their anticipated honors announced.

Honors for Commencement Ceremony

Anticipated honors will be announced during commencement exercises.

The GPA at the end of week 10 in the student's final semester will be used to calculate anticipated honors. Graduates with summa cum laude honors will receive a gold honor cord at the commencement ceremony.

Students who are approved to march early will not have honors announced.

Final honors will be noted on the diploma and transcripts.



Cap and Gown Information

Graduates are responsible for ordering their caps and gowns from Herff-Jones' website:

Regalia Guide

The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist. The gown for the doctoral degree has bell-shaped sleeves.

Gowns for the bachelor's or master's degrees are untrimmed. For the doctoral degree, the gown is faced down the front with velvet (usually black); three bars of velvet are used across the sleeves. These facings and crossbars may be of velvet of the color distinctive for the degree, or the institution's colors.

The academic hood is the identifying symbol of the degree. Hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. King University hoods are lined in red and blue. The length of the hood worn for the bachelor's degree is three feet, for the master's degree three and one-half feet, and for the doctoral degree, four feet. The hood worn for the doctoral degree only shall have panels at the sides. The binding or edging of the hood is two inches, three inches, and five inches wide for the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees, respectively; the color is indicative of the subject to which the degree pertains. Students should order a hood which aligns with their academic program as indicated below.

Regalia Guide Continued

Graduates may wear up to three academic accoutrements (cords, stoles, sashes, medallions, etc.), of the graduate's choice, at commencement ceremonies to represent:

Academic honors, honors programs, and honor societies

- Gold honor cords are reserved for those graduating *summa cum laude*.
- Graduates designated as Snider Honors Fellows will wear a medallion.
- Graduates who have been inducted into academic honor societies that are formally chartered and/or recognized by the University (and/or recognized by the Association of College Honor Societies) may wear academic accoutrements that are approved or supplied by the parent organization.

International affiliation

- International students will be provided with a stole indicative of the colors of their home country's flag.

Military affiliation

- Red, white, and blue military cords will be provided to all graduates who have or are serving in the United States Armed Forces.

Other academic accoutrements may be allowed within the following guidelines:

- Primary representation of an academic discipline or field of study is solely by the trim of the academic hood. Other accoutrements representing an academic program of study are thus superfluous and not allowed.
- Sashes/stoles may not be wider than 5 inches. Medallions may not be greater than 3 inches in diameter.
- Sashes/stoles imprinted with the name of an organization or entity, the logo or initials representing an organization or entity, and/or the specific achievements of the wearer may not include any derogatory, offensive, or divisive language or symbolism, nor should they be disruptive or draw undue attention to an individual person or group that would detract from the dignity of the occasion.

Any accoutrements or modifications to the student's academic apparel, such as flamboyant mortarboard decorations, that draw attention to an individual and detract from the dignity of the occasion are not permitted.

WHAT TO WEAR:

Graduates should wear business attire (jacket not required) under their academic regalia. Clothing and shoes are mandatory. Bare feet are not allowed. The commencement ceremony takes place outdoors in grass rain or shine. Graduates should expect to stand and walk on uneven surfaces. Shoes should be chosen with this terrain in mind. **Flat shoes are highly recommended.**

Anyone who presents themselves for participation in commencement who is attired in a way that is not consistent with this policy may be asked to make the necessary adjustments prior to the ceremony by the Chief Marshal or their designee. Failure to comply with such a request may result in the individual not being allowed to participate in the commencement ceremony.



Commencement Parking

Parking on campus is limited and will open at 7:00 AM. Limited shuttle service on campus will be provided. No parking passes will be issued to graduates.

Those who are mobility impaired and require special parking accommodations must have a state-issued handicap placard or register to obtain a commencement parking permit to use special needs parking. Please note that special needs parking permits issued by King University Security Office are only valid for the Commencement service on May 02, 2026.

If you do not have a state-issued handicap placard and need to park in the special needs parking you must register to obtain your parking permit.

Diploma Information

Final grades for spring are due after the commencement ceremony. Once all grades are collected, each student's final degree audit will be reviewed and degrees conferred.

Following the conferral of all degrees, diplomas will be ordered with our vendor, Parchment. Once the order has been placed, a notice will be sent to each graduate's King email account where they will be able to access a digital diploma. The digital diploma allows graduates to share their accomplishments on social media sites such as Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter, and LinkedIn. We encourage all graduates to promote their talents in places where employers and future King students will see them.

In addition to a digital diploma, each graduate will receive a paper diploma. Paper diplomas will be mailed the graduate's home address within 10 to 14 business days after release of the digital copy.

DIPLOMA FAQ

What name is printed on the diploma?

The graduate's name will appear on the diploma as indicated on their Intent to Graduate form.

How do graduate's ensure their diploma is mailed to their current address?

Diplomas are sent via USPS to the HOME address on file. Graduates may verify their address by going to my.king.edu and clicking Update Profile. There are different address types listed in the profile. We use the HOME address for mailing diplomas unless told otherwise prior to mailing.

Does the diploma include the student's major?

Diplomas only include the degree name (ex. Bachelor of Science) and any academic honors. Majors, minors, concentrations, etc are not included on the diploma. Academic transcripts contain specific program information.

Additional Information

Courses from Outside Institutions

Students taking courses from another institution within their graduation semester need to be aware that grades for such courses are due no later than 8:00 AM on Tuesday, May 5th.

Failure to meet this deadline could hold up conferral of the degree and the release of transcripts. Students are responsible for making arrangements with professors at other institutions to complete course requirements early, if necessary, in order to meet the King University deadline.

Family Diploma at Commencement

A graduating student who has a parent or guardian that is a member of the King University faculty, staff, or Board of Trustees may request that the parent deliver the diploma case during commencement in lieu of the President. The student should make the request in writing to The Office of Academic Affairs at provost@king.edu at least two weeks prior to commencement. Requests after this date will not be approved.

Guests of Graduates

Tickets are not required for commencement, but seating is provided on a first-come-first-serve basis. Pets are not invited to the ceremony. Service animals permitted under the control of its handler. Under the ADA, service animals must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered, unless the individual's disability prevents using these devices or these devices interfere with the service animal's safe, effective performance of tasks.

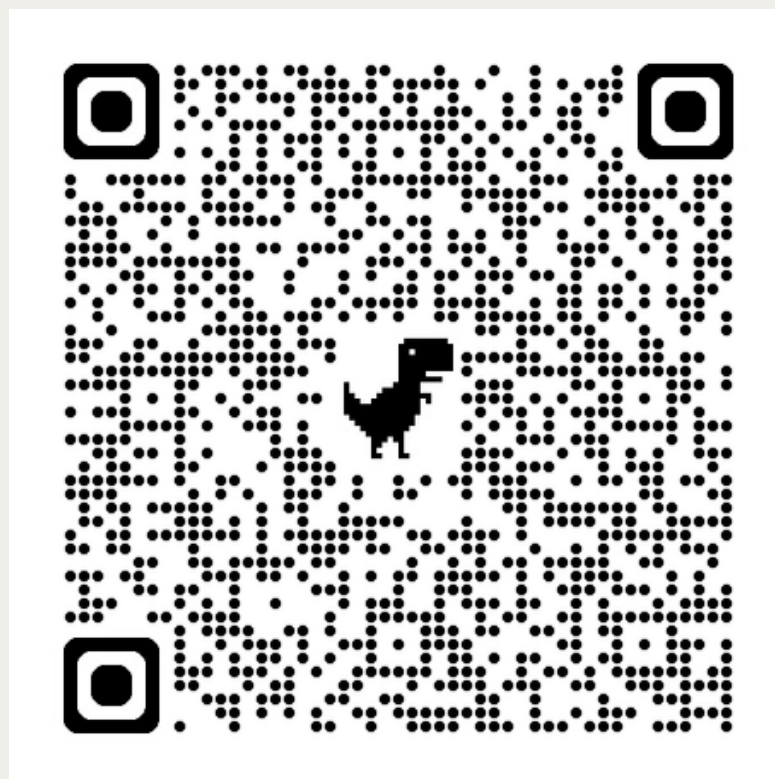
